GENERAL INFORMATION

1. This Competition Handbook is sent out in advance and will be subject to change at the sole discretion of the Fair
2. The management reserves the right to refuse additional entries when facilities are filled.
3. Special attention should be given to the filling out of entry forms: exhibitor's name, signature, complete mailing address and date. "Date of entry" refers to the date the entry form is filled out. Carefully cross-reference the Department, Division number, and Class number with the Competition Handbook. Mail-in entries are encouraged, but will not be acknowledged with a return receipt.
4. The management will take reasonable precaution to insure the safety of exhibits in the Fair, but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting and should any exhibit or portion thereof be injured, destroyed, lost or stolen, the management while giving assistance toward the recovery of same, will not be liable or make any payment of the value thereof.
5. State rules and Health rules have been revised and said rules apply to all entries in the fair. Please read state rules carefully. Available at Fair Office.
6. Use separate entry form for each different department. All entry forms and fees must be received no later than Monday, May 8, 5:00 p.m. or postmarked on same date.
7. Entry closing date is for submission of entry forms and fees only, and not for submission of exhibits. See department Schedules for submission of exhibits.
8. Mail or deliver entry form(s) and fee (s) to National **Orange Show**
689 South "E" Street
San Bernardino, CA 92408.
9. Entry fee must be included with entry form. No entries shall be accepted after the closing date for entries – Friday May 8, 2009
10. Entry forms received without entry fees or required information will be returned to exhibitor.
11. Entries must be made on the official entry form furnished by the National Orange Show. Photocopies of entry forms are permitted.
12. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitors to correct all deficiencies in connection with entries or exhibits which are required of them by the rules printed in the Competition Handbook.
13. All deficiencies must be corrected by the entry delivery date. Awards will not be given for exhibits on which deficiencies have not been corrected.
14. Same or identical items cannot be entered in more than one competitive program. An exhibit eligible in more than one division and or class shall be entered and judged only in the division and or class for which it best qualifies. The Fair may disqualify or transfer to the correct class any exhibit, which is not a true representation for the section or class in which it is entered.
15. Presentation of completed entry form shall be deemed acceptance of all National Orange Show Rules, Regulations and Guidelines. Acceptance includes permission to use your name, photograph and entry in publicizing the Fair.
16. All premium money will be paid from the Official Judge's Book only, and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibit. All premium checks will be made payable to the exhibitor in whose name the entry was made.
17. Entries must be on exhibit at the official opening of the Fair, please refer to the handbook for dates and times to delivery your exhibit to the Fair. Exhibits shall not be removed from the Fairgrounds prior to the release date printed in the handbook
18. Ground and buildings will be open the day after the Fair for removal of all entries. All exhibits and exhibit material not removed by specified dates and times will become property of the Fair. The Fair will not be responsible for entries or exhibits left after specified dates.

Section 42513 "Mature means having reached that state of ripeness which will insure palatability, after the removal of product from the tree, plant or vine."

1. Tags in duplicate for identification of articles will be furnished when articles are delivered to the exhibit tent.
2. Articles incorrectly entered will be reclassified.
3. No articles may be entered under "Any other" if there is a class specified for the article.
4. Exhibitors will not be permitted in the immediate vicinity of the judging area.
5. May enter 2 entries per class.
6. Enter through Gate 7 off arrowhead proceed to the Dome Building.

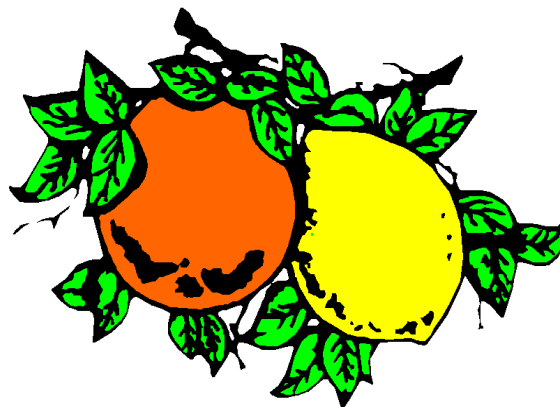

2. Amateurs only will be eligible for competition in all divisions. Junior exhibitors see Junior exhibitors Page. Needlework instructors or judges, those connected with needlework departments of stores, teachers, and those who make a practice of selling their handicrafts, store owners or operators, or those who sell or supply materials. The fair reserves the right to refuse to accept any article that shows evidence of being OLD or SOILED.
3. Articles made by more than one person are NOT eligible for entry.
4. Articles must be CLEAN AND NEATLY PRESSED. Do not mount articles.
5. Articles must not be entered under "Any other" if there is a class specified for the item.
6. SPECIAL AWARD: The National Orange Show offers a special award to the oldest person exhibiting in the Clothing Textile Divisions. Anyone over 65 year old is eligible for this award. The entry form must indicate the date of birth-month-day-, and year of exhibitor. Article being entered must have been completed within one year of opening date and not exhibited at previous Festival to be eligible.
